Spanish - The Hungry Giant

This half term, the children will be introduced to our Hungry Giant story, and learning how to ask politely for something. The children start by learning the nouns for fruits and vegetables then breakfast foods, with lots of games for repetition. The unit goes on to introduce the polite request and finishes with the Hungry Giant story which includes an impolite giant (an opportunity for the children to correct using the polite request) and fruits the children have seen during the unit.

Through a story, games, native speaker clips and independent tasks, learners will explore the following content, topics and language:

The Hungry Giant - *El Gigante Hambriento*

- Nouns for fruits and vegetables
- Nouns for breakfast foods
- Games for repetition of nouns
- Polite request - asking for something using the structure 'I would like... please'
- Story of Hungry Giant

- 3) I can understand and say some nouns for breakfast foods
- 4) I can recognise nouns for breakfast foods
